 - c. provide the reasons why the Application should be varied from the routes and schedules applied for, together with any relevant documentary evidence.
- 4. Persons who do not wish to formally intervene, but who wish to be heard and be part of the record, may do so by choosing from the methods described below:
 - a. provide their comments in writing to the Board at the address below and to Acadian at the address in paragraph 2 of this notice on or before noon, October 11, 2005; or
 - b. the Board will conduct telephone conference calls with interveners at its expense.
