2	CHAIRMAN: Thanks, Mr. Gorman. Public Intervenor?
3	MR. HYSLOP: Good morning, Mr. Chairman. Peter Hyslop,
4	Mr. Barnett, Ms. Young and Ms. Power.
5	CHAIRMAN: Thanks, Mr. Hyslop. Mr. MacNutt, who is with you
6	today?
7	MR. MACNUTT: I have with me Doug Goss, Senior Adviser and
8	John Lawton, Adviser.
9	CHAIRMAN: Thank you, Mr. MacNutt. Now if there is anybody
10	who is present and I haven't called them out, please go on
11	the record now.
12	And Mr. Hashey, I understand that you have something you
13	want to share with the Board?
14	MR. HASHEY: Yes, Mr. Chairman. First of all I thank the
15	Board for its indulgence this morning in allowing us to
16	have some further discussions, ongoing discussions with
17	the Board staff have been very helpful I think in
18	finding some solutions to most if not all of these
19	remaining IRs.
20	If it would please the Board I would go through the IRs
21	that are entitled in the in the bucket "not relevant"
22	which now most have become of some relevance. And we are
23	certainly going to try to provide the answers in a way and
24	in a manner that they can be provided. And I think I
25	don't think there is very much contentious. And I think

2	the idea was that I would proceed through these. And if Mr.
3	Hyslop finds that I have gone off track in some direction,
4	he can bring me right back on it.
5	CHAIRMAN: That is very encouraging, Mr. Hashey. Now that
6	most of some of the difficulties have overcome, perhaps
7	you better find a new term rather than bucket.
8	MR. HASHEY: Pail?
9	CHAIRMAN: Could I suggest "category". Pail. Please go
10	ahead, Mr. Hashey.
11	MR. HASHEY: Thank you. First one, Mr. Chairman and
12	members, is IR 104. This was the one we debated yesterday
13	which is the request from the PUB staff for information
14	going back a number of years.
15	It has been agreed and this would be an overlap and
16	would be the same as 112. Our answer would really be to
17	both of them effectively, which was the PI 112.
18	And what has been agreed is that we will provide five
19	years of information which was suggested yesterday or
20	discussed with the Board. And prior of course part of
21	that information needs to be integrated. How it will be
22	used, that is up of course to the people that are
23	involved, the Intervenors.
24	But that will be that documentation will be urgently
25	pulled together. I might say that the date for

2	delivery of all IRs was sort of or answers to IRs was
3	tentatively set on the schedule December 8th. There will
4	be a number that we will be answering. And we will meet
5	that date. There is a couple of Mr. Gorman's.
6	And there are a number of the PIs that are outstanding
7	that we can that we have agreed to answer now. We can
8	easily meet that date. And this one, we may need a little
9	bit more time. But we are certainly working to have that
10	well, well in advance of December 20th.
11	CHAIRMAN: Well, as far as the Board is concerned that is
12	perfectly understandable, Mr. Hashey. And simply do your
13	best.
14	MR. HASHEY: We will assure you that we will. And I think
15	we can meet this.
16	The next one is IR 4 which was a request for information,
17	really guarantee fee information. And our answer was in
18	the annual reports it is in the annual reports, you
19	know. The question of what uses may still be there. But
20	we will provide that answer.
21	CHAIRMAN: Good. Okay.
22	MR. HASHEY: IR 9 was still in some people's books. This
23	was the transfer orders. This by previous meeting it
24	was agreed that this wouldn't be necessary anymore. That
25	has been withdrawn by PI.

2	IR number 12, Question 4, we will provide an answer to
3	that. Effectively there are things haven't been
4	referenced by the EFC. But we will outline that all in
5	the answer that will be provided.
6	CHAIRMAN: And I guess the other questions have been
7	answered in that Interrogatory itself?
8	MR. HASHEY: That is correct, Mr. Chairman.
9	CHAIRMAN: Okay. Great.
10	MR. HASHEY: PI 16, again it is useful to have meetings. We
11	did have a meeting with the Public Intervenor and his
12	adviser last evening, and got a little bit of
13	understanding of what was being looked for here.
14	It is Question 2. And that is the of that part. And
15	what we will be doing will be providing information
16	indicating what is going from the Transco tariff into the
17	'06, '07 rate proposal.
18	This is really, I believe and if Mr. Barnett and Mr.
19	Hyslop want to change that that is what my
20	understanding is that they want. And we will provide that
21	answer.
22	CHAIRMAN: And the other two questions, there are
23	MR. HASHEY: They have been answered.
24	CHAIRMAN: answers in the

25 MR. HASHEY: The next one we run into is 34, IR 34 from the

1 - 2732 -Public Intervenor. Question 2 has been answered in -- PI IR 9 2 3 of November 28th, it's the latest round. So that one is 4 answered. And we will provide an answer to Question 5 number 1. б CHAIRMAN: Okay. Great. 7 MR. HASHEY: PI 101, Question 3, we will be -- there is no 8 answer to '06, '07. This is not available at this time 9 because there has been no approval. 10 But we will provide the answer for the year '05, '06. And 11 that has been discussed. And I believe that is what we 12 agreed that we would do in solution to that one. 13 Okay. CHAIRMAN: Yes. MR. HASHEY: Thank you, Mr. Chairman. PI-112, this is the 14 15 long and tedious one that we started into yesterday which 16 combines with 104. 17 CHAIRMAN: Yes. 18 MR. HASHEY: This will be answered in conjunction with the 19 answer to 104. 20 CHAIRMAN: Right. 21 MR. HASHEY: Thank you. Question 113, this is extremely 22 complex and it was agreed with Mr. Hyslop that he and Mr. 23 O'Rourke would meet further with us to try to define 24 exactly what they are looking for and what we can provide. There are some major problems in this one in relation to 25 26

2 the availability of information and the lack of formulas and 3 things of this nature that don't exist. I mean it's the 4 beginning of the benchmarking world I think. We will 5 address that and be back on the 20th of December if there 6 are issues, if we could, and hopefully we will find 7 solutions.

8 CHAIRMAN: Great. Thank you.

9 MR. HASHEY: Only one remains and this is the 114 which is 10 the PROMOD issue. The debate, of course, involves the 11 fact that there is a La Capra audit done which was done in accordance with the terms of reference of the PUB and 12 13 Disco working together on that. But what my friend is 14 looking for is the inputs that have gone into the PROMOD 15 issue. There are some very significant confidentiality 16 issues here. We obviously haven't been able to get ahold 17 of Genco or Mr. Bishop this morning, but subject to some 18 type of unexpected problem we would intend that -- and it 19 was agreed that Mr. Hyslop would send his expert to review 20 the inputs and that we would do this under a 21 confidentiality agreement, because I can list the inputs 22 and they are all the highly confidential Genco contractual 23 purchasing things that go into that, heat rates, many 24 things of that nature. The intent would be, subject to your approval, Mr. Chairman and the Board, that Mr. Hyslop 25

2	would have an expert come and review those documents
3	CHAIRMAN: Is that Mr. Meehan?
4	MR. HASHEY: We didn't really discuss that. Mr. Hyslop can
5	answer that.
6	MR. HYSLOP: Number 10. I'm not sure if it will be Mr.
7	Meehan or one of the staff, but that's the people we are
8	going to get in touch with, Mr. Chairman.
9	CHAIRMAN: Thank you.
10	MR. HASHEY: Yes. And he would review the inputs that we
11	would be doing this under a confidentiality agreement, and
12	if it turned out that some of this information is going to
13	be used in the hearing we, of course, would then have to
14	have an in camera hearing in relation to it.
15	CHAIRMAN: Would it be the intention, Mr. Hyslop, that if in
16	fact your expert were to find differences of opinion in
17	reference to those input that that would form part of a
18	confidential report to be filed in advance of his being
19	brought to testify in a confidential session?
20	MR. HYSLOP: Yes, Mr. Chair. The whole purpose of the
21	process we have gone through is to be in a position to
22	determine whether the pricing in the PPAs are reasonable,
23	and if at the end of our audit we felt there were some
24	real problems there that would be part of the evidence of
25	the Public Intervenor in this case.

2	CHAIRMAN: Just wanted that to be clear on the
3	MR. HASHEY: We had also agreed on that, that we would
4	receive a confidential report
5	MR. HYSLOP: Yes.
б	MR. HASHEY: and then we would be able to debate that
7	here before you.
8	CHAIRMAN: All right. Well that certainly falls I mean
9	La Capra from the Board's perspective was performing the
10	same functions as our Mr. Easson did some time ago in
11	going in and looking at the mechanics of PROMOD, but not
12	looking at the validity of the inputs that went in.
13	MR. HASHEY: Right.
14	CHAIRMAN: So that's fine. Yes, Mr. Hyslop.
15	MR. HYSLOP: Yes, Mr. Chair. And with that in mind I'm not
16	sure what the status of the motion is now that most of the
17	issues are resolved, but I would move that the NERA report
18	that we presented yesterday be entered and made part of
19	the record on the actual revenue requirement case.
20	CHAIRMAN: Can I come back to that, Mr. Hyslop?
21	MR. HYSLOP: Sure. You are in charge.
22	CHAIRMAN: Sometimes yesterday I wondered. That's all the
23	interogs. Mr. Hashey, I just wanted to check on a couple
24	of interogs. that we did deal with yesterday. And they
25	are under the categorization of not relevant I guess
0.6

2	not available sorry. My notes indicate that IR-69 is still
3	in play for parts 2 and 3, i.e., the Board will have to
4	make a decision on it.
5	MR. HASHEY: No, we didn't discuss that this morning. No,
6	that's correct.
7	CHAIRMAN: And then what about IR-72, the next one?
8	MR. HASHEY: That's the decommissioning report that we had a
9	problem presenting. We don't have it, of course.
10	CHAIRMAN: Well I mean that's the answer. Look, if I might
11	suggest is that you have achieved such remarkable results
12	this morning that perhaps after we deal with anything else
13	that's here that you might we might take a break and
14	you can sit down and talk about IR-69 and if necessary IR-
15	72, but if you don't have it you don't have it and that's
16	the answer, just to see if we can clear that up today and
17	the Board won't have to rule on it or anything else.
18	From your perspective, Mr. Hashey, is there anything
19	further?
20	MR. HASHEY: No, I don't believe there is, Mr. Chairman,
21	other than to say that we will try to comply with the
22	dates and move things ahead quickly. It's important to
23	us.
24	I should also just add though that we have filed our
25	Rogers' evidence and I have asked Ms. Milton to give me

1 - 2737 -2 dates and at this point she says she is unable to and I won't 3 discuss or ask for any dates here, but we try to work with her in the very near future to get that settled, because 4 5 as you can see there are experts now involved there. I understand that and I will undertake to 6 CHAIRMAN: 7 facilitate matters right after New Year's in regard to 8 setting those dates. I want to get a little closer to it to see how things are coming down to do it. 9 10 Now back to you, Mr. Hyslop, and dealing with --11 MR. HASHEY: One other thing, Mr. Chair. Just for the Board's information, the intent here is to file the public 12 13 policy answers by December 15 --CHAIRMAN: 14 Fine. 15 MR. HASHEY: -- to give some advance time just so that, you 16 know, you just don't come and look at it the first time on 17 the 20th. That's the goal to get that done. 18 CHAIRMAN: That would be appreciated. 19 MR. HASHEY: Yes. That's our intent, just so people are aware what we are working toward. 20 21 CHAIRMAN: Okay. 22 MR. HASHEY: On the report, if you want to come back to that 23 at some point, the evidence -- I know Mr. Hyslop is free 24 to file whatever evidence he may wish on the 16th. There

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2 are some issues there, of course, that we will be arguing as 3 part of the reports, La Capra and whatever, that we now --4 and on fuel issues, et cetera, that will be very relevant 5 probably to the matter. But there are still issues that 6 we would have with the parts of the report that may not be 7 necessary.

8 This is the report that he wishes to introduce? CHAIRMAN: 9 And I'm wondering if we shouldn't deal MR. HASHEY: Yes. 10 with that on the 20th after the answers have been seen and 11 the decision is made as to whether or not we haven't 12 completed what all that is really required and that there 13 is no re-visiting or review of the issues that involve the 14 restructuring and whether it should have been done or not. 15 CHAIRMAN: All right. May I suggest this, that the Board 16 will take a break. Mr. Hyslop, I want you to have an 17 opportunity to talk to Mr. Hashey about what he has 18 suggested or do you want to barrel on with this? 19 MR. HYSLOP: No, I don't want to barrel on with that. Ι will talk to Mr. Hashey and then -- you know -- I have got 20 21 the right to file it on the 16th as evidence in my case in 22 chief and I will do it then. I was just saying that today 23 is the 1st. If it was the 16th I would file that report 24 as part of my case on the revenue requirement, Mr. Chair. The one point -- this is a very minor point but Mr. 25

2	Barnett tells me we had better be correct, and it deals with
3	interrogatory Disco PI IR-9, and Mr. Hashey is correct,
4	but just for the record it's only the question 9
5	question IR-9, question 2 that is withdrawn. Questions
6	1 and 3 will remain on the record.
7	CHAIRMAN: Hang on. Is this this is the one from July or
8	August, not November?
9	MR. HYSLOP: November 14th, 2005. It's under the tab, Not
10	Relevant. It's the ones we just looked at. Mr. Hashey
11	indicated on the record that we had agreed to withdraw it.
12	Just for the record I wanted to say it's only question 2
13	that's withdrawn.
14	MR. HASHEY: That's correct. I apologize. The others are
15	answered I believe.
16	MR. HYSLOP: Yes. The other two answers that they have made
17	stand.
18	CHAIRMAN: Okay. Mr. MacNutt?
19	MR. MACNUTT: Just so we can keep up with what is going on,
20	that was PI IR-what?
21	MR. HYSLOP: 9.
22	MR. MACNUTT: Thank you.
23	CHAIRMAN: Well, we will take a break. Let us know when you
24	have had an opportunity to talk and we will come back in
25	then.

3	CHAIRMAN: Is it Mr. Hashey or Mr. Hyslop who is
4	MR. HASHEY: On 69 the decision has been made that
5	Mr. Hyslop will attempt to redraft the question so we can
6	understand it a little better. And we will attempt to
7	give an answer. If there is still an issue we will deal
8	with it on the 20th.
9	CHAIRMAN: Good.
10	MR. HASHEY: On 72 which is the decommissioning study we
11	will make an attempt to have that available. We are not
12	certain that we can. We are going to do everything we can
13	to have that available.
14	And when Mr. Hyslop comes to review the contracts, if
15	there is still an issue there or sorry, not the
16	contracts, the monthly reports that he would have an
17	opportunity to review that just to confirm the numbers
18	that we have provided. Because we have provided numbers.
19	And this is a confirmation effort. So we will make that
20	effort, that he can see that. It will be a confidential
21	document.
22	Really I think those are the answers to the two,
23	Mr. Chairman.
24	CHAIRMAN: I think the only one the only other thing left
25	was the Meehan Report as to whether or not it went on the

2	record now or if we waited until the 16th. Is that the date
3	for filing Intervenor evidence?
4	MR. HYSLOP: I believe so, Mr. Chair. And we will file it
5	on that date as part of our evidence.
б	CHAIRMAN: Well, okay. All I wanted you gentlemen to
7	discuss was, if it is available now, that is a piece of
8	paper we can read between now and then. Because there is
9	going to be a lot on.
10	MR. HYSLOP: Yes.
11	CHAIRMAN: But if Mr. Hashey has any problem with doing that
12	then we will wait until then.
13	MR. HASHEY: What I would suggest is that I have no
14	problem with you reading it. It is filed for the
15	purposes. And then you will have read it.
16	And then we can make the arguments on the 20th as to
17	whether it should be marked as an exhibit or parts of it
18	should.
19	MR. HYSLOP: It is my case, Mr. Chair. I have got a right
20	to present my case.
21	CHAIRMAN: I could have anticipated you saying that. Shall
22	I suggest that we mark it for identification today. And
23	then we will deal with it on the 20th. How is that?
24	MR. HASHEY: That is fine with us.
25	CHAIRMAN: Or sorry, on the 16th you can try to file it.

2	And then you can have an argument on the 20th.
3	MR. HYSLOP: That is satisfactory, Mr. Chair.
4	CHAIRMAN: Okay. Will you have or does yes, okay,
5	good.
б	In the 22 years I have been sitting up here I hate to
7	say something like this but it has been a long time
8	since I ever marked anything for identification. How is
9	it handled in the court system?
10	MR. HASHEY: Just that very way. They just mark it number 1
11	or put an initial to it and a number to it for
12	identification.
13	CHAIRMAN: Okay. So in other words I could say, marked for
14	identification PI 13.
15	MR. HASHEY: Yes.
16	CHAIRMAN: And then if it does in fact become an exhibit you
17	assign the same number?
18	MR. HASHEY: Correct.
19	CHAIRMAN: Okay. We will do it that way then.
20	MR. MACNUTT: Or you could create a separate category. And
21	that is marked for
22	CHAIRMAN: Start again, Mr. MacNutt. I missed the first
23	part there.
24	MR. MACNUTT: Alternatively you could start a separate
25	category.

So it is marked for identification PI 13. And I will 6 7 refer to it as the Meehan Report. MR. HYSLOP: That would be fine. 8 9 CHAIRMAN: Great. All right. Any other matters? Mr. 10 Hyslop? 11 MR.
